Please can you ensure your child's Parent Pay account is credited with enough money to cover the cost of their school meals. If this is not the case, we will be asking you to provide your child with a packed lunch until any debt is cleared.

Polite Request

Please ensure cars are parked in one of the marked bays and not abandoned in the entrance or exit, which causes blockages and a backlog onto Fentham Road.



This half term has been just as A-MA-ZING as the first half! We've continued our learning journey, laughed lots and really begun to work independently! Some of our highlights have included:



Year 4:

What an action packed half-term the Year 4 children have had! In the second half of the Autumn term, we have been totally immersed in experiencing life in the Roman era. We have learned all about Roman Britain in our History lessons, have created Roman mosaics in Art and read and analysed different Roman myths in English, producing some amazing writing along the way. All of our knowledge was then put to the test when we had a Roman visitor join us for a day. During this fabulous enrichment activity, we spent the whole day learning more about the Romans and trying out lots of activities that we might have experienced if we had lived during the times of the Roman Empire. Firstly, we found out what it was like to be a Roman legionary and we practised marching in formation with our shields. Our next session gave us the opportunity to try on Roman clothing and armour, investigate their pottery and write with quills. We found it was quite tricky not to produce ink blotches! In the afternoon we played some Roman games, like Ludus Latrunculorum, which we loved and which really got us thinking about strategy. We finished off the day with a Roman myth and some role play as Roman gladiators.



Aside from our Roman experience, we were also excited and a little nervous to perform in a cheerleading competition, showcasing all of the skills that we had been learning in PE. Our coach, Dani, had prepared the class well and, despite a hitch with our music, the class performed brilliantly. Dani complimented all the children on their hard work and said that they were one of the best groups that she had ever worked with. Well done year 4 for your enthusiasm and perseverance.

During the final week of the term, we were really lucky to have a special visit from the Fire Service (all planned of course!). Our visitors came to speak to us about keeping ourselves safe from fire and how to identify potential fire risks. This work complemented our work on Electricity in our Science lessons and, once again, the children were able to amaze our visitors with their knowledge of keeping safe with electricity.

After such a fun-filled and packed half-term, the children thoroughly deserve a time to rest and prepare themselves for the next part of their learning journey in the Spring term.

Year 5:

In Year 5 this half term, the children have been tasting, designing and making their own Christmas biscuits. They tasted and examined the ingredients in shop bought biscuits, thinking about why the ingredients that manufacturers use are sometimes different, with companies perhaps adding in extra colouring or flavouring to make their biscuit's appearance better or the taste more enhanced for the consumer. All children worked hard on creating an attractive biscuits design, thinking also about appearance, texture, flavour and size. They then drew a detailed design of their biscuit before adapting a basic biscuit recipe and writing out their own recipe instructions for making it. We were so impressed with the maturity of the children when it came to making their biscuits and the sensible manner in which they went about it. Well done to all children for producing a fabulous end product which was decorated beautifully. Reports were that they tasted yummy!

In ICT Year 5 have been continuing to develop their coding skills to design 2D games and real life simulations such as traffic lights and they also used '2Design and Make' to design the packaging for their biscuits. So not only did they taste yummy, they looked good too!

Year 5 put their dodgeball skills and Games Values to the test when a team were chosen to represent GFES at the Solihull Borough Dodgeball Tournament. It was a fantastic evening; the children impressed us with their powerful shots and dodging skills, but it was their teamwork, honesty and resilience that really shone through. We were very proud to be awarded the silver medal scoring 116 points. (The winners scored 117. So close!)

Attendance

To support us to secure good attendance for all of our pupils and to address concerns regarding any child's poor school attendance and punctuality, we will be continuing to work with Central School Attendance and Welfare Service Ltd (CSAWS) next term.

Each half term, attendance registers are rigorously scrutinised to identify any attendance issues. This includes children falling below 95% attendance, children who are below 90% attendance and therefore at risk of becoming persistent absentees, children with any unauthorised absence and any punctuality concerns.

Your child may be referred to a CSAWS Attendance and Welfare Officer if their attendance or punctuality is causing concern. They will then contact you by phone, letter or home visit to discuss the school's concerns and how attendance and punctuality can be improved.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Reporting Absence and Leave of Absence Forms

Schools have a duty to account daily for all children registered at the school. Therefore, if your child is absent due to sickness or other unexpected circumstances, it is critical that you let us know by 8:30am on that day. This can be done via our phone line on 01675 442800 option 1, or through emailing the school office at office@george-fentham.solihull.sch.uk.

Please be aware, if we have not received a reason for your child's absence, we will work through your child's contact list to try to establish the reason for this absence. If after doing everything possible we are still unable to establish why your child is absent, we may escalate this to a safeguarding concern.

Parents / carers are asked to complete a Leave of Absence Form, in advance, for every absence. Please note this includes planned absences or short notice absences due, for example, medical appointments during the school day. Forms are available by contacting the school office.

Holidays in School Time

Head Teachers are only allowed to grant leave of absence in <u>very exceptional circumstances</u> and where the application has been made <u>two weeks in advance</u>. This does not include family holidays, therefore, we ask that you do not book holidays in school time as these will be unauthorised and could lead to a referral to the Local Authority Enforcement Team for a fixed penalty fine or prosecution.

Should you require any further information, or wish to discuss a leave of absence request please contact the school office.

Medicines in School - REMINDER

Our Medicines in School and Administering Medicines policy are both on our school website, along with the permission forms for prescribed and over the counter medicines.

Should your child require any medication during the school day, please complete the relevant form and bring this, with the medicine, directly to the school office. Medicines must not be sent in with children.

It is really important that your child's medicine has the prescription label on it and that your instructions exactly match the dosage prescribed.

Medical, Dental & Optician Appointments

Following advice from CSAWS, we would like to ask for your support in organising medical, dental and optician appointments outside of the school day. Please note if there is no alternative, you may be asked to show a copy of your appointment letter or card to the school office and complete a leave of absence request.

Dietary Requirements / Food Allergies

Please note it is the responsibility of Parents/Carers to advise the school office, in writing, of any dietary requirements or food allergies for each individual child. This is not required for food preferences but for medical conditions such as allergies or religious beliefs. This information will be stored on your child's record throughout school.

Healthy Schools: Break time Snacks and Water Bottles

Snacks

As part of our Healthy Schools approach, we ask for your support in only sending in pure fresh or dried fruit and vegetables for morning snack. No other snacks are permitted. Please note fresh fruit or vegetables are provided by school for all children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. Key Stage 2 children should be provided with a fruit or vegetable snack from home.

Water Bottles

Children have access to their water bottles during the day and are regularly reminded to drink. Please encourage your child to do this and ensure that drinking bottles contain water only. Should you wish your child to have milk at break time details are available from the school office.

No Nuts in School

We have a number of children in school who have a severe nut allergy. These allergies can be life threatening. In order to keep all of our children safe, please ensure that you do not send any nuts or products containing nuts into school with your child, at any time.



The BASE

The BASE provides before and after school care and Nursery wrap around care during term time. The BASE is not run by school, but by a completely separate Voluntary Management Committee. If you have any queries regarding this provision, please contact Mrs Tina Coley directly on 01675 443913
