Year 1

This term Year 1's topic is 'Amazing Africa' and the children have really enjoyed all their learning so far. In English we have been looking at the story of 'Handa's Surprise' and the children have been using adjectives to describe the different fruits. They have also really enjoyed the story 'Meerkat Mail' and we even have our own Sunny the meerkat who has been going to stay with children at their houses. In Geography, Year 1 have started to learn the location of the seven continents and five oceans and they can locate the equator on a world map or globe. We found out that Handa lives in Kenya, and we located Kenya on a map of Africa and identified the human and

physical features by looking at a selection of photos. In Art, the children have learnt about East African Kente Cloth patterns and discovered what the different colours mean. As well as all of this, we have been adding and subtracting to 20 in maths, using the film 'The Jungle book' as our inspiration in our dance lessons and learning about the different types of animals (reptiles, mammals, birds, fish and amphibians) in science! We are so proud of how hard the children have been working and how much they are trying to improve their concentration during lessons. Have a wonderful half term and we look forward to continuing with more fantastic work on Amazing Africa when the children return to school!

Infant Agility Festival

Mad Museum Visit

Year 3 had a fabulous trip to the MAD Museum as part of our learning on Forces and Magnets in Science. We saw some fantastic displays which demonstrated both contact and non-contact forces in action which we have discussed with enthusiasm back in the classroom.

Roman Soldier

During the first week of term, Year 4 were very fortunate to spend a day with a Roman visitor. We started the morning learning how to be soldiers, including how to protect ourselves with shields and how to march in formation (it was really hard to keep together). We were surprised to discover how heavy all their equipment was too; especially the chain mail. Back in the classroom we had to really concentrate whilst using dip pens to write our names using the Greek alphabet. We also made pottery images like the ancient Greeks made when they went to pray in the temple. Finally, at the end of a busy day, everyone enjoyed learning about the gladiators. We even had the chance to act out being a gladiator using spears and nets!

This half term in English, the children have been immersed in their learning of the features and dramatic language of the stories in the Arabian Nights. This topic has also linked beautifully to our history topic, the Golden Age of Islam. They are now confident at playing a number of pieces of music and are continually increasing their knowledge of musical terms.

REMINDER: Attendance and Requests for Leave of Absence

To support us to secure good attendance for all of our pupils and to address concerns regarding any child's poor school attendance and punctuality, we will be continuing to work with Central School Attendance and Welfare Service Ltd (CSAWS) in 2022-23. Each half term, attendance registers are rigorously scrutinised to identify any attendance issues. This includes children falling below 95% attendance, children who are below 90% attendance and therefore at risk of becoming persistent absentees, children with any unauthorised absence and any punctuality concerns.

Your child may be referred to a CSAWS Attendance and Welfare Officer if their attendance and punctuality is causing concern. They will then contact you by phone, letter or home visit to discuss the school's concerns and how attendance and punctuality can be improved.

Please note, Headteachers are only allowed to grant leave of absence in <u>very exceptional</u> <u>circumstances</u> and where the application has been made <u>two weeks in advance</u>. This does not include family holidays. Should you require any further information, or wish to discuss a leave of absence request please contact the school office.

Medicines in School - REMINDER

Our Medicines in School and Administering Medicines policy are both on our school website, along with the permission forms for prescribed and over the counter medicines.

Should your child require any medicine during the school day, please complete the relevant form and speak directly to a member of the office staff.

Medical, Dental & Optician Appointments

Following advice from CSAWS, we would like to ask for your support in organising medical, dental and optician appointments outside of the school day. Please note if there is no alternative, you may be asked to show a copy of your appointment letter or card to the school office.

Dietary Requirements / Food Allergies

Please note it is the responsibility of Parents/Carers to advise the school office, in writing, of any dietary requirements or food allergies for each individual child. This is not required for food preferences but for medical conditions such as allergies or religious beliefs. This information will be stored on the child's record throughout school.

Healthy Schools: Break time Snacks

As part of our Healthy Schools approach, we ask for your support in only sending in pure fresh or dried fruit and vegetables for morning snack. No other snacks are permitted. Please note fresh fruit or vegetables are provided by school for all children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. Key Stage 2 children should be provided with a fruit or vegetable snack from home. Children have access to their water bottles during the day and are regularly reminded to drink. Please encourage your child to do this and ensure that drinking bottles contain water only. Should you wish your child to have milk at break time details are available from the school office.

No Nuts in School

We have a number of children in school who have a severe nut allergy. These allergies can be life threatening. In order to keep all of our children safe, please ensure that you do not send any nuts or products containing nuts into school with your child, at any time.

School Meals - Outstanding Debt

Parents of children in KS2: School meals are £2.30 per day.

Please ensure that you check your account regularly and credit your account with sufficient funds to pay for your child's school lunches. If a debt exceeds one week's school lunches a hot meal cannot be provided until the debt is cleared and the account is in credit.

Please contact the school office if you think your child may be eligible for free school meals.

The BASE

And finally.....

Enforced Closure of School: Friday 17th February 2023.

Thank you to all of our families for your support this morning. The decision to close school is never an easy one to make and is only ever taken when there is a significant health and safety risk.

As you are aware, this morning there was no water or heating in school. From 7:45am onwards we were reviewing the latest information on Seven Trent's website. We also contacted Severn Trent directly and they were able to provide further information from the engineer on-site. We were informed that the burst pipe had been located but there was no timescale as to when this would be fixed and when the water supply would be fully returned to our school.

In a situation like this, we are under pressure to make a decision, based on the information we have available to us at the time, as to whether or not it is safe for our children and staff to open the school.

In consultation with the Senior Leadership Team and the Chair of Governors it was decided that, on the grounds of health and safety, it was unsafe to go ahead and open school.

Staff worked quickly to provide online learning and this was available on our website from 10:30am. We have also contacted Hams Hall and the coach company and are in the process of rebooking the Year 5 trip.

We are extremely sorry for the inconvenience that this has caused and would like to thank you for your understanding in this matter.

On behalf of everyone at George Fentham Endowed School, I would like to wish you and your family a safe and enjoyable half term holiday.

We look forward to welcoming the children back to school on Monday 27th February 2023.
