

COVID-19 Reminders

HOLIDAYS ABROAD

In line with school policy, please be aware, holidays should not be booked in term time.

If you are travelling abroad over the summer break, please ensure you consult and follow the **most up-to-date Government guidance and advice**. If you are travelling back from a country and are required to quarantine, you must inform the school office if this impacts on your child returning to school in September.

We ask for your full support in this matter in order that we can continue to keep all of our children, staff and families safe.

TRACK AND TRACE

We have received advice from Solihull Council that from Monday 19th July education and childcare settings are no longer being asked to carry out contract tracing. As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work to identify close contacts - either directly with the positive case or with Parents/Carers if a child is the positive case.

This now brings to a close the contract tracing we have done, as a school, over the last 17 months. I would like to say a huge thank you to the office staff who have been outstanding in providing this service, monitoring every weekend and over the holiday periods.

Reports & Meeting New Class Teachers

End of year reports have now been sent out, or are available for collection. We have received a huge amount of positive feedback and are really grateful for your kind and supportive comments. Please send back any feedback you have as your views and thoughts are really important to us in evaluating all that we do. Please note, if a Parent has previously requested a second copy of their child's report, this is now ready for collection from the school office.

Due to the requirement to maintain Class Bubbles, children have been unable to visit their new classrooms this term but Teachers have, where possible, met their new class and spent time talking about next year. Please be reassured that we are aware some children may be slightly

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anxious about this transition and staff will be providing additional support and reassurance once the children start back in September.

PTFA

Thank you to the PTFA for their generous donation of £4,000. This has funded a new interactive whiteboard in Year 1 and our Subject Leaders are currently purchasing resources for their areas to benefit the whole school such as new world globes for each class and percussion instruments.

Starting on **Saturday 10th July** children can register to take part in a challenge to read 6 books over the holidays and earn themselves stickers, posters, rewards and a certificate and medal. **And it's all completely FREE!** There are lots of games and quizzes too, plus artists and storytellers in many of Solihull's libraries. The Summer Reading Challenge is proven to support reading for pleasure and help children **avoid the reading dip** across the summer. Children can read whatever they choose for the Challenge, and in any format, physical or digital. If children complete the Challenge they can enter a free prize draw to win four tickets to see Cinderella, the Panto at The Core Theatre this Christmas. Oh yes they can!

REMINDER: Attendance and Requests for Leave of Absence

To support us to secure good attendance for all of our pupils and to address concerns regarding any child's poor school attendance and punctuality, we will be continuing to work with Central

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School Attendance and Welfare Service Ltd (CSAWS) in 2021-22. Each half term, attendance registers are rigorously scrutinised to identify any attendance issues. This includes children falling below 95% attendance, children who are below 90% attendance and therefore at risk of becoming persistent absentees, children with any unauthorised absence and any punctuality concerns.

Your child may be referred to a CSAWS Attendance and Welfare Officer if their attendance and punctuality is causing concern. They will then contact you by phone, letter or home visit to discuss the school's concerns and how attendance and punctuality can be improved.

Please note, Head Teachers are only allowed to grant leave of absence in **very exceptional circumstances** and where the application has been made **two weeks in advance**. This does not include family holidays. Should you require any further information, or wish to discuss a leave of absence request please contact the school office.

Medicines in School - REMINDER

Our Medicines in School and Administering Medicines policy are both on our school website, along with the permission forms for prescribed and over the counter medicines.

Should your child require any medicine during the school day, please complete the relevant form and speak directly to a member of the office staff. Please ensure all medicines are collected at the end of term, checked and returned, where necessary, on the first day back in September.

Medical, Dental & Optician Appointments

Following advice from CSAWS, we would like to ask for your support in organising medical, dental and optician appointments outside of the school day. Please note if there is no alternative, you may be asked to show a copy of your appointment letter or card to the school office.

Dietary Requirements / Food Allergies

Please note it is the responsibility of Parents or Carers to advise the school office, in writing, of any dietary requirements or food allergies for each individual child. This is not required for food preferences but for medical conditions such as allergies or religious beliefs. This information will be stored on the child's record throughout school.

No Nuts in School

We have a number of children in school who have a severe nut allergy. These allergies can be life threatening. **In order to keep all of our children safe, please ensure that you do not send any nuts or products containing nuts into school with your child, at any time.**

Concerns raised by Parents and members of our Community

A reminder that dogs are not allowed on any part of the school premises, which includes the playground at the end of the school day. Dogs can be intimidating and frightening for some of our children. Please be aware, if you have a dog with you (including if you are carrying your dog) you will be asked to leave school grounds and wait outside.

Inconsiderate parking in the village at school drop off & pick up times continues to be a problem with some local residents unable to drive on and off their driveways during these times. Please consider parking at Fentham Hall and walking the short distance to school as this will ease parking congestion around the village.

Please ensure that you check your account regularly and credit your account with sufficient funds to pay for your child's school lunches. If a debt exceeds one week's school lunches a hot meal cannot be provided until the debt is cleared and the account is in credit.
