School and Sports Events

Nursery Umberslade Farm

The Nursery class visited Umberslade Farm at the end of June and had a great day. The children enjoyed seeing a wide range of animals and their young. We were able to feed many of them including two alpacas, who have recently arrived at the farm. Meeting an enormous pink pig called Beyoncé proved to be the most memorable moment of the day as she climbed up onto her back trotters to see us over the wall of her pen and oinked loudly hoping for her lunch!

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Nursery Visit from Reverend Stuart

Nursery children were very pleased to have a visit into the class from Reverend Stuart. He told us about his role at the church and some of the children asked him a question. We invited him to join us at snack time and we sang him our daily 'thank you' prayer

Reception Twycross Zoo

On Friday 8th June Reception class began their 'Amazing Animals' topic with a visit to Twycross Zoo and the children saw many different animals. Their most memorable experience was creeping through the Lemur enclosure, whilst trying very hard not to wake up the Red-Bellied Lemur! Follow up work in class included, drawing a map of the zoo and research to find out more about the animals they saw. Towards the end of term, children performed their 'Down in the Jungle' assembly for their parents. They worked very hard to learn song words and actions and we were all very proud of the children on the day.

Reception Visit from Reverend Stuart

The children in Reception have had an exciting summer term which started with a visit from Reverend Stuart who told the 'Noah's Ark' story using props. The children really enjoyed having Reverend Stuart in their classroom.

Year 1 Pizza Making

During this terms topic 'Pizza Making,' Year 1 have been developing their food technology skills. The children looked at all the different ways adults tried to encourage them to make healthy food choices and eat more vegetables. They then used their knowledge to design a vegetable pizza that would appeal to six year olds. They learned how to wash their hands, table surfaces and vegetables to get rid of harmful germs. They also learned how to safely use knives, peelers, graters and kitchen scissors. Finally the children cooked their pizzas and ate them!! Yum Yum!!!



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Year 2 Assembly

Whether it was the Plague and Great Fire of London (History), the Hajj, or pilgrimage (RE), the wonderful stories explored in English or their research about the Moon, the children in Year 2 provided us with an informative and entertaining journey through their learning this year. They were confident, clear and loved every second of performing to an audience. Well done Year 2!

Year 2 Tri-Golf Festival

After three sessions with a local golf coach, the children had a wonderful time participating in the Tri-Golf tournament at Tudor Grange Pitch and Putt. They competed hard, but with a clear understanding of fair play, and finished 11th out of 15 teams. Well done to all of the children and a big thank you to the parents who came with us.

Y2 Cheerleading Festival

After several weeks of coaching for the whole class, a group of 20 children represented our school in the Year 2 Cheerleading Festival at Lode Heath School. Despite their coach not being able to be there on the day, the children rose to the occasion and performed their routine brilliantly, finishing in a fabulous 2nd place. Congratulations Year 2 - we are very proud of you!

Year 2 INSPIRE Workshop

The children and parents, of Class 2, had a wonderful time at their "Message in a Bottle" INSPIRE Workshop. We also included an Online Safety focus to our workshop, with children showing their parents/guests the ICT Suite and explaining all about their Online Safety learning whilst finding and printing off images. However, the main focus of the session was on the transition from KS1 to KS2 and the children, with plenty of support from their helpers, produced some beautifully designed bottles and wrote some wonderful scrolls about their feelings on moving to Class 3. These were then passed on to the Class 3 teacher, Mrs Briggs, who will go through them on the first day back in September. A huge thank you to everyone who attended and helped out, this was a great opportunity for children and parents to collaborate in school. Feedback from both parents and children was extremely positive.

Year 2 Thinktank

The children in Class 2 enjoyed a fantastic day at the Thinktank in Birmingham. With a science focus on the topics of 'Our Amazing Bodies' and 'Materials/Recycling', the children had the opportunity to explore the whole museum. With great knowledge and understanding from their learning in school, combined with some fabulous questioning to find out more, the children demonstrated what good scientists they are. A great end to the school year for Year 2!

Year 3 Geography Walk around Hampton in Arden Village

Earlier this term Year 3 were getting into the World Cup spirit by learning about some of the countries taking part in the football competition. During their Geography lessons, the children researched the different climate regions, time zones and man-made and physical features within countries around the world. They then investigated, in detail, the town of Hamelin in Germany, comparing it to their own village of Hampton-in-Arden. The children became explorers on a field trip around the village, looking at land use and how the village has adapted to a growth in population. Year 3 have really enjoyed their learning this half-term.

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Y4 Assembly

Year 4 Assembly on Friday 29th June treated us to a delightful trip back in time to the momentous age of the Restoration Period. Using Pippa Goodhart's story "Raven Boy" we learnt about how the horrors of the Plague and then the Great Fire of London impacted on the lives of one little family. The story centres on a young boy called Nick who hates the King and all he stands for, his father is dead, pressed for the navy then killed fighting against the Dutch. Nick reasons if he catches the plague too he could take it into the tower, the domain of the King whose wickedness caused all these miseries. The children performed the story using wonderful story telling, acting, dancing as well as beautiful singing. Who knew that Charles II could rap? A huge "well done" to Class 4 for presenting a most entertaining assembly!

Strings Assembly

Year 4 along with other Instrumentalists thoroughly enjoyed their Strings assembly in July, playing the instruments they have been learning all year with the Solihull Music Service as part of the Wider Opportunities Programme. They performed five exciting pieces to an audience comprised of year four parents and the rest of the school, with their repertoire ranging from Mamma Mia to Elbow Rock. It was a fittingly joyous end to a wonderful year of music and Year 4 should like to thank Miss Gosling and Miss Chippendale for their tirelessly patient teaching and The Fentham Trust for their continued support in funding this excellent musical opportunity.

Year 4 Chance to Shine Cricket Festivals & Finals

What a fabulous time Year 4 have had with their cricket this term! After some expert sessions with Marie, our coach, the whole class set off for the regional competition at Berkswell Cricket Club. Both our A and B teams played with passion, skill and endless energy, keeping focused and showing great skills of collaboration on a hot, sunny day. Aided by Mrs Keast's dynamic and accurate bowling, our B team won all their matches and emerged victorious. Meanwhile, our A team (helped by some similarly impressive bowling from Mrs Kelly) had tied with Berkswell school for first place and so a play-off ensued. Our team held their nerve and won by a clear margin. We were through to the final...

Edgbaston was the venue for the final of the Warwickshire Cricket Festival. We arrived to be told that we were one of 21 teams to have gone through from an initial 137 schools taking part. So, a great achievement even before the first ball had been bowled. The A team was there to represent everyone in Year 4 and the 15 children took this honour seriously, playing their socks off and competing with ferocity and exemplary sportsmanship. Buoyed up by terrific family support, our batters looked unbeatable and George Fentham scored more sixes than any other team in the tournament. The entire team grew in confidence and stature with some excellent catches coming from our fielders on all sides of the pitch. We were brilliant! Finishing in 6th place, it was an excellent result for the school and we weren't at all far behind the winning team in a very close competition. All in all, it was a memorable and hugely enjoyable day with Year 4 representing the high standards of our school to perfection.

Year 5 Chance to Shine Cricket Festivals & Finals

Class 5 had the opportunity to take part in the Chance to Shine Cricket Festival at Berkswell Cricket Club on the 28th June. In their coaching sessions in the run up to the Festival, the children enjoyed learning how to bat, bowl and field, and have relished improving their skills across the board. Having the opportunity to learn from specialist cricket coaches has been a huge privilege and one from which Year 5 has benefitted immensely. The children were well-prepared for the event and very keen to do well. We were absolutely delighted that two of our

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teams won their categories overall, with our third coming second in their category. We are very proud that our mixed A Team went on to compete in the area finals at Edgbaston Cricket Ground, coming 12th out of 22 schools on the day, and out of over 100 schools in total. Huge congratulations to all the children for their excellent effort and sporting attitude, on what were two very hot and sunny days - Mrs Kermode and Mrs Kelly are very proud of them all!

Year 5 Bikeability

Year 5 had a fabulous week of Bikeability in June. It was a valuable opportunity to learn about keeping safe on the roads and how to take care of your bicycle whilst cycling on the lanes. The instructors were very impressed with the children's behaviour and it is great to know that all children who participated now know how to keep themselves safe out on their bikes.

Year 5 Visit to Bishops Wood Field Centre

Year 5 had an amazing time at Bishops Wood Centre in Worcestershire which they visited to complement their Anglo Saxon History topic. The children became Saxons for the day, travelling across the choppy seas on a Saxon long ship, making pinch pots out of clay and decorating them, spinning sheep's wool, and hammering copper on an anvil to make it change from malleable into hard metal. The children stepped back in time into an Anglo Saxon hall and finished off the day with a fabulous team building exercise which involved gathering wood to make a den and then gathering material from the forest to cover it and make it watertight. The staff at the centre commented on the lovely manners of the children who were a real credit to the school.

Year 6 Condover Hall

From the 18th - 22nd July 2018, Year 6 enjoyed a fabulous week's residential to Condover Hall in Shropshire. Children took part in a wide range of activities from fencing to kayaking and archery to trapeze! A wonderful time was had by all and, as always, Year 6 children showed exemplary behaviour and support for each other. Thank you to Mrs Kelly and Mrs Philpotts for accompanying Mrs Edmeades and the class. Thank you also to the Fentham Trust for funding the coach for this visit.

Year 6 Diocesan Leavers' Service

On Monday 9th July, Year 6 went to St Martin's in the Bullring for the Diocesan Leavers' Service. This service led by Bishop Anne, the Bishop of Aston, celebrates the end of the children's time at primary school and the move to their new secondary schools. This was an enjoyable service, full of singing (complete with actions!) and proved to be very thought-provoking for our Year 6 children.

Creative Responses to Classical Music

On Monday 25th June, the entire school took part in a creative activity planned by Mrs Kermode based around listening to a piece of music. Mrs Kermode took a whole school assembly which involved listening to a variety of pieces of classical music, thinking about how those pieces made us feel, what mood was portrayed and what images they created in our minds. The children then thought more broadly around these concepts, exploring how changing instruments, tempo or dynamic might alter their ideas about the piece. During the assembly, the children had the opportunity to share their ideas and all staff were particularly impressed by the attitude of the children who really entered into the spirit of the activity. The children then went back to their classes to listen to a minimalist piece of music by John Adams called *A Short Ride in a Fast Machine* and had the opportunity to respond in a creative way. All children and classes produced something individual using a variety of media such as clay, collage, paint, pastel and 3D models, as well as some written work. With input from their teachers, knowledge and understanding from their learning in school, and some super questioning to find out more, the children demonstrated what fabulously creative and original ideas they had collectively and individually. It was lovely to hear the comments from the children about how much fun it had been!

Cystic Fibrosis Assembly and Non-Uniform Day

On Friday 6th July, George Fentham turned yellow for the day! All the children looked seasonably bright and sunny in order to raise money for the Cystic Fibrosis Trust. Mobile Phones in School

Medicines in School

May we remind you that a medicine permission form must be completed and discussed with a member of the office staff if your child requires any medicine during the school day. It is extremely important that all medicine has the prescription label clearly displayed on the medicine, stating your child's name, dose and frequency. If this information is displayed on packaging, we will need this packaging to be supplied. This arrangement will also apply for Calpol, therefore, if your child requires Calpol during the school day the bottle must have a prescription label with the above details.

Dietary Requirements / Food Allergies

Please note it is the responsibility of Parents or Carers to advise the school office, in writing, of any dietary requirements or food allergies for each individual child. Please note this is not required for food preferences but for medical conditions such as allergies or Religious Beliefs. This information will be stored on the child's record throughout school.

School Meals - Outstanding Debt

Parents of children in KS2

Due to the flexibility of the ParentPay system allowing parents to choose which days they wish their child to have a school meal, it is important to keep your account in credit; reminders are generated daily for children who have no credit on their accounts. Please note that if a debt

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exceeds one week's school lunches of £10.25 (£2.05 per day) a hot meal cannot be provided until the debt is cleared and the account is in credit.

Please be aware that the cost of a school meal will increase from 1st September to £2.10 per day (£10.50) per week. Please contact the school office if you think your child may be eligible for free school meals.

Attendance and Requests for Leave of Absence

To support us to secure good attendance for all of our pupils and to address concerns regarding any child's poor school attendance and punctuality, we are continuing to work with Central School Attendance and Welfare Service Ltd (CSAWS). Each half term, attendance registers are rigorously scrutinised to identify any attendance issues. This includes children falling below 95% attendance, children who are below 90% attendance and therefore at risk of becoming persistent absentees, children with any unauthorised absence and any punctuality concerns.

Your child may be referred to a CSAWS Attendance and Welfare Officer if their attendance and punctuality is causing concern. They will then contact you by phone, letter or home visit to discuss the school's concerns and how attendance and punctuality can be improved.

Please note, in line with the Local Authority Solihull Attendance Policy, Head Teachers are only allowed to grant leave of absence in **very exceptional circumstances** and where the application has been made **two weeks in advance**. This does not include family holidays. Should you require any further information, or wish to discuss a leave of absence request please contact the school office.

Medical, Dental & Optician Appointments

Following advice from CSAWS, we would like to ask for your support in organising medical, dental and optician appointments outside of the school day. Please note if there is no alternative, you may be asked to show a copy of your appointment letter or card to the school office.

School Bank

We run a School Bank every Wednesday morning from 8.30am to 9.00am under the supervision of Mrs Lowe from HSBC and Year 6 cashiers. As a school we feel it is very important to help children become financially responsible so through the School Bank it is a fantastic way to help teach children how to manage and save from an early age. All children from age 7 are invited to open a savings account with an opening deposit of £10.00, further deposits in cash or cheques can be made from as little as £1.00. Once children reach the age of 11, the bank will open a current account for them, which will run alongside their savings account and with parent/carer permission the children would be able to have a debit card. For more information you can come into school to see the School Bank Team in the library area every Wednesday morning.

General Data Protection Regulations - GDPR

You may now be aware new regulations for the Data Protection Act come in to force on 25th May 2018, known as GDPR. To comply with the new regulations we have updated our Privacy Notice and Data Protection Policy. These can be found on the school website within the Statutory Information section. **From the start of the 2018/19 academic year we will be issuing new consents/ permissions to be used in conjunction with the Acceptable Usage Policy.**
