IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Reporting Absence and Leave of Absence Forms

Schools have a duty to account daily for all children registered at the school. Therefore, if your child is absent due to sickness or other unexpected circumstances, it is critical that you let us know by 8:30am on that day. This can be done via our phone line on 01675 442800 option 1, or through emailing the school office at office@george-fentham.solihull.sch.uk.

Please be aware, if we have not received a reason for your child's absence, we will work through your child's contact list to try to establish the reason for this absence. If after doing everything possible we are still unable to establish why your child is absent, we may escalate this to a safeguarding concern.

Parents / carers are asked to complete a Leave of Absence Form for every absence. Please note this includes planned absences or short notice absences due, for example, to medical appointments during the school day. Forms are available by contacting the school office.



Coronation Celebrations

We were delighted to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III on Saturday 6th May with all of our children. In the weeks leading up, each class took a particular theme and produced some amazing work which is now displayed throughout our corridors. Nursery and Reception dressed up in a robe and crown and thought carefully about what they would do if they were the King or Queen for a day. We had some great ideas including:

- "I would be a mermaid."
- "I would help people in the earthquake."
- "I would make unicorns real again."

Year 1 children showcased their super art skills by designing their very own stain glass windows based on those in Westminster Abbey. Year 2 used their fantastic research skills to find out all about the orb and the sceptre, whilst Year 3 and 4 focused on investigating previous Kings and Queens and a royal family tree. Year 5 thought carefully about King Charles' commitment to a multicultural and inclusive society, whilst Year 6 found out all about The Prince's Trust. Visitors to school this half term have been incredibly impressed with the quality and standard of work displayed.

On Friday 5th May, we started our day with a whole school Coronation Celebration Assembly. Throughout the morning children worked on a wide range of Coronation linked learning activities and just before lunch we held our very own GFES Coronation! We chose 2 children who had birthdays on or near the Coronation day to be our King and Queen. As a school, we dressed in red, white and blue and made our flags to wave. The Reception outdoor area became our "Buckingham Palace Balcony", we created a road down the middle of the playground (just like The Mall) and our outdoor classroom became "Westminster Abbey". After a short journey down "The Mall" to be crowned and a balcony appearance by our King and Queen, the rest of the school joined together to sing the National Anthem. Our King and Queen then led everyone in for a super picnic lunch. This was a truly memorable and enjoyable day and I would like to thank all of our staff and children for making this such a special occasion.

REMINDER: Attendance

To support us to secure good attendance for all of our pupils and to address concerns regarding any child's poor school attendance and punctuality, we are continuing to work with Central School Attendance and Welfare Service Ltd (CSAWS) in 2022-23. Each half term, attendance registers are rigorously scrutinised to identify any attendance issues. This includes children falling below 95% attendance, children who are below 90% attendance and therefore at risk of becoming persistent absentees, children with any unauthorised absence and any punctuality concerns. Your child may be contacted by a CSAWS Attendance and Welfare Officer if your child's attendance and punctuality is causing concern. This could be by phone, letter or a home visit to discuss the school's concerns and how attendance and punctuality can be supported and improved. Please note, Headteachers are only allowed to grant leave of absence in very exceptional circumstances and where the application has been made two weeks in advance. This does not include family holidays. Should you require any further information, or wish to discuss a leave of absence request please contact the school office.

Medicines in School - REMINDER

Our Medicines in School Policy and Administering Medicines Policy are both on our school website, along with the permission forms for prescribed and over the counter medicines.

Should your child require any medicine during the school day, please complete the relevant form and speak directly to a member of the office staff.

Medical, Dental & Optician Appointments

Following advice from CSAWS, we would like to ask for your support in organising medical, dental and optician appointments outside of the school day. Please note if there is no alternative, you will be asked to complete a Leave of Absence Form and may be asked to show a copy of your appointment letter or card to the school office.

Dietary Requirements / Food Allergies

Please note it is the responsibility of Parents/Carers to advise the school office, in writing, of any dietary requirements or food allergies for each individual child. This is not required for food

preferences but for medical conditions such as allergies or religious beliefs. This information will be stored on the child's record throughout school.

Healthy Schools: Break time Snacks

As part of our Healthy Schools approach, we ask for your support in only sending in pure fresh or dried fruit and vegetables for morning snack. No other snacks are permitted. Please note fresh fruit or vegetables are provided by school for all children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. Key Stage 2 children should be provided with a fruit or vegetable snack from home. Children have access to their water bottles during the day and are regularly reminded to drink. Please encourage your child to do this and ensure that drinking bottles contain water only. Should you wish your child to have milk at break time details are available from the school office.

No Nuts in School

We have a number of children in school who have a severe nut allergy. These allergies can be life threatening. In order to keep all of our children safe, please ensure that you do not send any nuts or products containing nuts into school with your child, at any time.

School Meals - Outstanding Debt

Parents of children in KS2: School meals are £2.30 per day.

Please ensure that you check your account regularly and credit your account with sufficient funds to pay for your child's school lunches. If a debt exceeds one week's school lunches a hot meal cannot be provided until the debt is cleared and the account is in credit.

Please contact the school office if you think your child may be eligible for free school meals.

Dogs near Playground Entrance

A huge thank you to all of our parents and carers for keeping dogs away from our children coming into and leaving school. We continue to ask for your full support in keeping all dogs away from the path between school and the allotments at the start and end of the school day.

Not all of our children are comfortable around dogs and some children are particularly frightened and nervous around them. We hope everyone is able to support us in keeping this area free from dogs at all times. Thank you.
