2013 – 2014 Use of the Pupil Premium allocation

The Pupil Premium budget was used to fund, or part fund, the following:

- Numicon maths resources and training for all teachers.
- ICT equipment, including iPads
- Teacher, 1 day per week, to deliver high quality intervention and extension group work for YR, Y1 & Y2.
- Teacher, 1:1 support, 1 session per week
- Teacher to deliver high quality intervention and extension group work in Y4 & Y5, x2 mornings per week.
- Teaching Assistant small group, phonics, reading, writing and maths intervention, support and extension throughout all Key Stages. (Team of 5)
- Inclusion coordinator release time to monitor & support those Pupil Premium children with multiple vulnerabilities.
- Child mentor hours to address attendance and pastoral issues for identified children and families.
- Contribution to music tuition cost.
- Contribution to residential cost.

2014 – 2015 Proposed use of the Pupil Premium allocation (£1,300 per pupil)

The Pupil Premium budget will be used to fund, or part fund, the following:

- Additional curriculum resources.
- Additional non-fiction reading books.
- Small group targeted intervention in phonics, reading, writing and maths, delivered by additional teaching assistant hours.
- Small group targeted intervention in phonics, reading, writing and maths, delivered by additional non-classed based teachers.
- Teaching Assistant 1:1 bespoke support e.g. fine / gross motor skill session (BEAM).
- Teacher 1:1 tutoring reading, writing and maths in KS2.
- Inclusion coordinator release time to monitor & support those Pupil Premium children with multiple vulnerabilities.
- Child mentor hours to address attendance and pastoral issues for identified children and families.
