## REMINDER - CHANGE TO THE TIMINGS OF THE SCHOOL DAY FOR 2023/34

In line with the Government's expectation that all schools should offer a minimum week of 32.5 hours, a letter was previously sent out by our Chair of Governors, Mrs Kavanagh, to update parents confirming that we have extended our school day by 10 minutes from September 2023. This has been achieved by adding on 5 minutes to the start and 5 minutes to the end of the school day. Please check below for the new timings:

Please be aware, all children, apart from Nursery children, must be on-site by 8:50am as this is the official start to our school day. The gate leading to the playground will be closed promptly at 8:50am to enable staff to return to their classrooms and begin the day with the children.

Any child arriving after 8:50am must be taken round to the main school office, by an adult. You will be asked why your child is late and the reason will be added to your child's attendance record. Children arriving after this time may be given a "late" mark. Please do not leave children at the gate after 8:50am, as they will be locked out and must be accompanied by an adult to the main office. Thank you for your support in this matter.

### Defibrillator in School

Last week we took delivery of a defibrillator which was issued to school by the Department for Education. Whilst we hope that this is something we will never need to use, we are extremely pleased to now have this equipment on our school site.

For information, the defibrillator is located in the school office for immediate access in an emergency.

Year 1: The Herbert Gallery and Museum





On Friday, the 23<sup>rd</sup> June, Year 1 went to the Herbert Art Gallery and Museum in Coventry. The day began with a talk from an expert about toys, in particular Victorian toys. The session was very hands on as the children got the opportunity to dress up as Victorian children, as well as Queen Victoria. Our Queen Victoria was the perfect choice and helped organise the entire session. The children were shown a range of old toys and they compared many of them with objects and toys that we have today. The class got to play with a cup and ball, a hoop and stick, a spinning top and as a treat they took part in a race on a hobby horse!

After the session, the children split into groups and had the chance to explore the rest of the museum. They learnt about toys from different generations and saw what our parents and grandparents might have played with.

We were also so lucky to be able to see Dippy the dinosaur! He is currently residing in the museum and the children were so excited to meet him! We worked out that if we all held hands and stood in a line, we measured the same length as Dippy!

In the afternoon, another expert, at the museum, helped to develop our understanding of different works of art, including paintings from centuries ago and sculptures. The talk was

fascinating and the children listened intently. The children got to study different sculptures in more detail, and they all enjoyed taking part in observational drawings. We were so proud of all the children and how they conducted themselves throughout the day.

### Year 2:

### Curriculum

This half term we've thoroughly enjoyed our topic on William Shakespeare and focused on "A Midsummer Night's Dream". We also had an Online Safety focus to our workshop, with children showing their parents/guests the ICT Suite and explaining all about their Online Safety learning whilst finding and printing off images to use on their bottles. These were then passed on to Mrs Hodge, who will then go through them on their first day back in September. A huge thank you to everyone who attended and helped out - a great opportunity for children and parents to collaborate in school.




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### Sporting Activities

### School Council and Online Safety Council

As elected representatives of their class, the children have made decisions, for example consulting on and ordering wet weather resources for each class, showing democracy in action and supporting our work on British Values in school.

### Attendance

To support us to secure good attendance for all of our pupils and to address concerns regarding any child's poor school attendance and punctuality, we will be continuing to work with Central School Attendance and Welfare Service Ltd (CSAWS) in 2023/24.

Each half term, attendance registers are rigorously scrutinised to identify any attendance issues. This includes children falling below 95% attendance, children who are below 90% attendance and therefore at risk of becoming persistent absentees, children with any unauthorised absence and any punctuality concerns.

Your child may be referred to a CSAWS Attendance and Welfare Officer if their attendance and punctuality is causing concern. They will then contact you by phone, letter or home visit to discuss the school's concerns and how attendance and punctuality can be improved.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Reporting Absence and Leave of Absence Forms

Schools have a duty to account daily for all children registered at the school. Therefore, if your child is absent due to sickness or other unexpected circumstances, it is critical that you let us know by 8:30am on that day. This can be done via our phone line on 01675 442800 option 1, or through emailing the school office at <a href="mailto:office@george-fentham.solihull.sch.uk">office@george-fentham.solihull.sch.uk</a>.

Please be aware, if we have not received a reason for your child's absence, we will work through your child's contact list to try to establish the reason for this absence. If after doing everything possible we are still unable to establish why your child is absent, we may escalate this to a safeguarding concern.

Parents / carers are asked to complete a Leave of Absence Form, in advance, for every absence. Please note this includes planned absences or short notice absences due, for example, for medical appointments during the school day. Forms are available by contacting the school office.

### Holidays in School Time

Head Teachers are only allowed to grant leave of absence in <u>very exceptional circumstances</u> and where the application has been made <u>two weeks in advance</u>. This does not include family holidays, therefore, we ask that you do not book holidays in school time as these will be unauthorised and could lead to a referral to the Local Authority Enforcement Team for a fixed penalty fine or prosecution.

Should you require any further information, or wish to discuss a leave of absence request please contact the school office.

## Medicines in School - REMINDER

Our Medicines in School and Administering Medicines policy are both on our school website, along with the permission forms for prescribed and over the counter medicines.

Should your child require any medication during the school day, please complete the relevant form and bring this, with the medicine, directly to the school office. Medicines must not be sent in with children.

It is really important that your child's medicine has the prescription label on it and that your instructions exactly match the dosage prescribed.

PLEASE ENSURE ALL MEDICATION IS COLLECTED AT THE END OF TERM FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE. NEW MEDICATION, ALONG WITH A NEW FORM, SHOULD BE SENT IN ON TUESDAY  $5^{\text{TH}}$  SEPTEMBER.

### Medical, Dental & Optician Appointments

Following advice from CSAWS, we would like to ask for your support in organising medical, dental and optician appointments outside of the school day. Please note if there is no alternative, you

may be asked to show a copy of your appointment letter or card to the school office and complete a leave of absence request.

## Dietary Requirements / Food Allergies

Please note it is the responsibility of Parents/Carers to advise the school office, in writing, of any dietary requirements or food allergies for each individual child. This is not required for food preferences but for medical conditions such as allergies or religious beliefs. This information will be stored on your child's record throughout school.

### Healthy Schools: Break time Snacks and Water Bottles

#### **Snacks**

As part of our Healthy Schools approach, we ask for your support in only sending in pure fresh or dried fruit and vegetables for morning snack. No other snacks are permitted. Please note fresh fruit or vegetables are provided by school for all children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. Key Stage 2 children should be provided with a fruit or vegetable snack from home.

### Water Bottles

Children have access to their water bottles during the day and are regularly reminded to drink. Please encourage your child to do this and ensure that drinking bottles contain water only. Should you wish your child to have milk at break time details are available from the school office.

### No Nuts in School

We have a number of children in school who have a severe nut allergy. These allergies can be life threatening. In order to keep all of our children safe, please ensure that you do not send any nuts or products containing nuts into school with your child, at any time.



### The BASE

The BASE provides before and after school care and Nursery wrap around care during term time. The BASE is not run by school, but by a completely separate Voluntary Management Committee. If you have any queries regarding this provision, please contact Mrs Tina Coley directly on 01675 443913.
